

## **SCDA Monologue Competition**

# Marking Guidance - Performance

#### **Points to Consider:**

Please note there is no expectation that all these things need to be present in every performance but these are meant as things to look out for and consider when assigning a mark to each category. Are they helping the performance or detracting from it?

## 1. Characterisation and Interpretation:

Has the performer created a believable character? Does it fit with the time and place? Is this sustained throughout? Has the performer established what the character needs/wants? Is it clear who they are speaking to? Is it clear how they feel about who they are talking to? Have they demonstrated an interpretation of the text? Are they using textual clues?

#### 2. Voice:

Has the performer demonstrated an appropriate use of voice? If they used an accent, is it clear and sustained throughout? Do they vary the pace when appropriate? Do they use emphasis appropriately? Is the tone in keeping with the piece? Does the volume match what they are saying (not the volume of the filming but if, for example, they are required to speak quietly are they doing it)? Do they vary the use of word groupings? Have they used pauses appropriately?

### 3. Movement:

Has the performer used movement skills to enhance their characterisation? Does the performer's body language match their tone? Has the performer used gestures to enhance their performance? Is the movement naturalistic? Does the posture match the character? Has the performer used the space available to them to enhance the piece? Does the performer use eye contact appropriately (are they just staring at the camera or looking off in the distance)?

### 4. Dramatic Achievement:

What impact has the performance had? Has the performer met the challenges of the monologue? Does it engage throughout the whole performance? Has the performer combined all the elements (characterisation, voice, physical) successfully? Does the performance achieve what it set out to?
